The Timothy School "MEDICATION ADMINISTRATION REQUEST and CONSENT" (MAR) form must be completed ANNUALLY by the Licensed Prescriber and the parent/guardian before any medication (prescibed or "over-the-counter") may be administered at school. Medication orders can be accepted via fax or electronically from a Licensed Prescriber and may be on the Prescriber's letterhead instead of form MAR if they contain all of the required information and if the parent/guardian has provided written authorization for the administration of medication. The medication order MUST include the following information:

- Student' name
- Name, signature and phone number of the Licensed Provider
- Name of the medication
- Route and dosage of the medication
- Frequency and time of administration of the medication
- Effective date of medication order
- Specific directions for administering if necessary
- Potential adverse reactions or contraindications with other medications (prescribed or "overthe-counter") taken by the student

The following additional guidelines apply for the administration of medication (prescribed or "over-the-counter") at school:

- Delivery of the medication (prescription or "over-the-counter") to the health office in a properly labeled "original"/pharmacy container with student's name. A 30 day supply of medication for a student can be stored at school.
- It is the parent's/guardian's responsibility to provide the school with new physician orders if the
  dosage/frequency of the medication changes or if the medication is to be discontinued or has
  expired.
- MEDICATION ORDERS MUST BE RENEWED EACH SCHOOL YEAR
- If the date on the prescription is expired or more than one year old, the medication will not be given at school.
- Unused/ expired medication should be retrieved from the health office within one week after the
  medication is discontinued/expired at school; otherwise the school nurse will dispose of the
  medication.

Please keep us informed of any new medication and changes in medication given at home(new medication, dose, time, frequency, discontinued etc.). Please ask your child's teacher for a "Change of Medication" form for this purpose. It could be a crucial factor in a child's emergency treatment.
